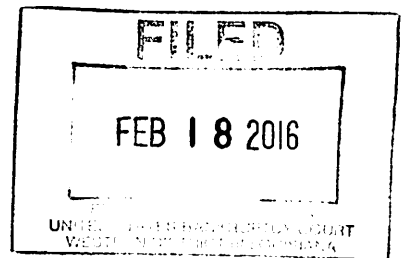

**GENERAL ORDER PROVIDING FOR DISMISSAL OF CASE
FOR FAILURE TO FILE REQUIRED DOCUMENTS**
**(Applicable to all cases in the Alexandria Division and ONLY Chapter 13 Cases
in the Monroe Division)**

The Bankruptcy Code (11 U.S.C. §101 *et seq.*) and the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure require that certain schedules, statements, lists and notices be filed either with the petition for relief (the “Petition”) or within a set number of days of filing the Petition, as follows:

- (i) In a Chapter 7, 11 or 13 case, 11 U.S.C. §521(a)(1) and Rule 1007(c) of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure require that the debtor file certain schedules, statements, and other documents either with the Petition or within 14 days after filing;
- (ii) In a Chapter 13 case, Rule 3015(b) of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure require that the plan be filed either with the Petition or within 14 days after filing;
- (iii) In a Chapter 7 case in which the debtor is an individual, 11 U.S.C. §521(a)(2)(A) requires the debtor to file a statement of intention within 30 days after filing the Petition; and
- (iv) In all cases, 11 U.S.C. §329 and Rule 2016(b) of the Federal Bankruptcy Rules of Procedure require any attorney for the debtor to file a statement of compensation for services rendered in the case within 14 days after filing the Petition.

(The foregoing deadlines are referred to in this Order collectively as the “Deadlines” and individually as the “Deadline.”)

Any Deadline may be extended as permitted by the Bankruptcy Code and the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure for good cause shown upon motion filed before the expiration of the Deadline (the “Extended Deadline”).


In order to carry-out the above referenced provisions of the Bankruptcy Code and Rules of Federal Bankruptcy Procedure, and to ensure compliance with the Deadlines and any Extended Deadline,

IT IS ORDERED that, without further notice or a hearing, an order of dismissal may be entered in any case in which the debtor fails to file the required schedules, statements, lists and notices by the applicable Deadline.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, without further notice or a hearing, an order of dismissal may be entered in any case in which the debtor fails to file the required schedules, statements, lists and notices by the applicable Extended Deadline.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this order applies to (a) all cases filed in the Alexandria Division and (b) Chapter 13 cases filed in the Monroe Division.
