**GENERAL ORDER PROVIDING FOR DISMISSAL OF CASE
FOR FAILURE TO FILE REQUIRED DOCUMENTS**

Federal Rule of Bankruptcy Procedure ("Rule") 1007 provides that in cases filed under chapters 7, 11 and 13 of the Bankruptcy Code, the debtor shall file certain schedules, lists and statements together with or within 15 days after filing the Petition.

If consumer debts are secured by property of the estate in a chapter 7 case, Title 11 U.S.C. §521(2)(A) requires the debtor to file a statement of intention within 30 days after filing the Petition.

Title 11 U.S.C. §329 and Rule 2016(b) require any attorney for debtor to file a statement of compensation for services rendered in a case under the Bankruptcy Code.

Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that failure of a debtor to file all schedules, lists or statements required by Rule 1007(b) & (c) or by §521(2)(A) within any delays allowed by the Rules or the Court will result in dismissal of the case without further notice and/or hearing.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that failure of the debtor's attorney to file the statement of disclosure of compensation required by §329 within the delays allowed by Rule 2016(b) or any timely extension allowed by the Court will result in dismissal of the case without further notice and/or hearing.

This order supersedes the general order of the same title dated 18 May 2000.
